Academic Highlights

2025 CANDIDATES PRAYER DAY

The KPSEA and KJSEA candidates are expected to have a Combined Prayer Day on 18th of October 2025. The event will bring together the candidates, families and the school fraternity in committing the candidate classes to God. We shall embark on an ambitious preparation programme for all of them this coming term, before they sit these important National Assessments.

PROGRESS REPORTS

All learners Progress Reports have been shared on the Jsps Portal. Parents/Guardians are advised to log into the portal using any browser or the Jsps App to access the learners Results. Use the holiday period to discuss the results and chart the way forward for the learner in the coming term. Kindly note that the app is available for IOS users too.

KINDERGARTEN

The learners have continued to gain from the enriched school programmes tailor-made for their level. The Playgroup class has seen more tremendous growth in their academic and social abilities. PP1 classes have continued to increase their vocabulary, refine on team sports and enhance their independence and discipline. Our PP2 Graduation is upcoming in the Third Term. All are looking forward to celebrate the graduands on their next level placement.

KNEC SBAs (School Based Assessments)

All learners in Grades 3,4,5,7 and 8 will be assessed by KNEC using written assessments in early October. These assessments are very crucial in their assessment journey. The scores at each level, but Grade 3, will be aggregated to form the complete score. For those in Junior School, the Assessments will form part of their aggregated 10% for Grade 7 and 8 that will contribute to the final KJSEA score.

Grades 6 and 9 do not ordinarily get assessed since they are preparing for their National Assessments. The KPSEA results form part of the aggregated 20% at KJSEA level KJSEA forms the aggregated 60% at the Grade 9 level. The KJSEA results will be a factor to consider in placements of these learners at Senior School.

GRADE 9 CAREER TALKS AND JOB SHADOWING

We would like to inform you that in the course of the term, we shall invite industry experts in various fields to engage learners at Grade 9 with talks, sessions and demonstrations of what it takes to be an expert in a given career. We shall reach out to your expertise through a Google Form so that we can tap into your experience. This will help us prepare these learners for the Senior School Pathways, and Career of Choice. Having undertaken a psychometric test for all of our learners, they are now greatly aware of their careers and the subject combinations to take them there. We shall also request, formally, that where possible, the institutions you work for could allow the learner to be attached briefly for a Job Shadow opportunity. Here, the learner will report to the workstation to just observe and learn what happens in that career line. This programme will be piloted, then scaled down to other junior school learners in the course of time.

In the course of the August Holidays, the school will release more information regarding the device specifications to be considered before one can acquire a device for use in January 2026.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

We encourage all parents who have relocated from their initial routes to new neighbourhoods to contact the school early in advance and get guidance on how they can be assisted. This will reduce hiccups once the new term resumes later this month.

DISCIPLINE

The school would like to bring to your attention that our concern has shifted from the initial indiscipline issues to misbehaviour using internet-enabled devices. We have sensitized parents during meetings against granting learners unfettered access to these devices. We urge you to undertake basic steps to regulate what your child does on the device, when they access it and for how long.

We have handled incidences this term whereby very young learners are exposed to explicit content using these devices. These learners have curiously inducted their friends who also get caught up in this web. The misuse of social media platforms to insult, form groups to plan and execute bad deeds cannot be wished away. Some of the learners use the parent's gadget without the parent suspecting any wrongdoing. As a parent who is concerned about the misuse of gadgets, we encourage you to regularly go through your child's phone and offer guidance as well as corrective action when the child misuses the phone.



BOARDING

As we continue to nurture independent and responsible citizens through our boarding programmes, we would like to mention that boarding spaces will ideally be reserved for Grade 8 and 9 classes in 2026. All other requests are handled on a case-by-case basis. All Day scholar learners in these two classes are advised to fill the Boarding Conversion Form in readiness to join boarding in January 2026.

GOING GREEN

Juja St. Peter's is now running on 100% green energy. We have invested in solar power to ensure efficiency and constant power in the institution while also playing our part in ensuring we take care of the environment.
